- ✓ Gallymoor roundabout and problem dyke running from tip to roundabout, waiting for work to be done
- ✓ Waiting for increasing the non-grass area around the village entry sign opposite the Kingfisher, plus cycle track meeting plus notice-board move plus CCTV for village centre
- ✓ ID badges, the 2 missing badges have been applied for
- ✓ Burial Committee and consecration, cemetery planning application has been submitted, waiting for validation and distribution to consultees
